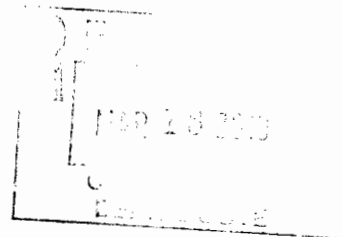

Dear Judge Cote:

I am writing to bring to the Court's attention a request that we have received from BlackRock Financial ("BlackRock") on behalf of its client class member AXA Premier Funds ("AXA"). BlackRock has been in communication with the Claims Administrator, The Garden City Group, Inc. ("GCG"), and us to see if we could assist it in getting AXA's second distribution check reissued and it sent us a letter dated March 17, 2010 (a copy of which is enclosed) explaining the unique circumstances.

A valid claim was submitted for AXA in the above-captioned case and the claim was approved to receive a distribution from the net settlement fund. The initial distribution check in the amount of \$23,902.60, which was sent in December 2006, was cashed. A second distribution check in the amount of \$5,514.41 was mailed in February 2008, but was never cashed. Since the uncashed check was in an amount greater than \$100, pursuant to the Court's Order of September 18, 2009, GCG sent a notification to BlackRock of the uncashed check, noting that there was a 30-day window within which to request a reissuance of the second distribution check. GCG received a timely request from BlackRock on behalf of AXA to have the check reissued. The check, in the amount of \$5,514.41, was reissued on November 16, 2009. That check was not cashed and, by its terms, pursuant to the September 18th Order, it could not be cashed after December 16, 2009.

BlackRock recently contacted GCG and was advised that the Court's Orders precluded GCG from providing any further reissuance checks. Mr. Ahrens of BlackRock thereafter called our offices and then sent the enclosed letter.

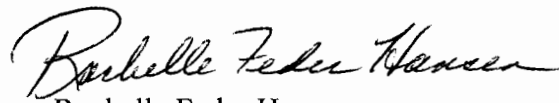

Mr. Ahrens requested that, in light of the unique circumstances, we take steps to see if we could get a reissued check. We are, therefore, presenting Mr. Ahrens' letter to Your Honor for consideration by the Court. We note that there have been other people who also did not cash their reissuance checks before they became stale, who were referred to the Order setting the bar date for reissuance of such checks. Thus, far, only one person, Mr. Stephen Berch, asked that his situation be brought to the attention of the Court, and the Court, by Order dated March 5, 2010, directed that his check be reissued. Now, BlackRock, on behalf of AXA, has also asked that we pursue its request for reissuance of a check.

We will await the Court's response to this request and advise BlackRock accordingly.

On behalf of our client, AXA, we timely filed a proof of claim with respect to the WorldCom class action and the enclosed check was delivered to AXA's custodian bank, JP Morgan on or around December 1, 2009. Unfortunately, AXA had closed its account with JP Morgan by that time and, therefore, JP Morgan did not recognize AXA as a custodial client. By the time JP Morgan contacted us and we instructed JP Morgan where to send the check, the check was stale and AXA was unable to cash it.

The claims administrator is unwilling to re-issue the check to AXA, even after we explained the circumstances for the delay.

We respectfully request that you take steps to have the check re-issued to AXA so that AXA can collect the money it is properly due in connection with this settlement.
